TITLE: Generalized Policies and Procedures for the Selection and Screening of Library Materials
State Board of Education Ref: 18-5-20, 18-5-21d

- A. Broad objectives in relation to the selection of media and materials
 - 1. To secure a well-balanced collection of materials which will supply a variety of reading and audio-visual experiences.
 - 2. To recognize children's interests and the expansion of their interests.
 - 3. To aid in broading the student's fields of knowledge through the use of books.
 - 4. To meet the need for materials in relation to the current curriculum and basic trends in education.
 - 5. To make determinations as to whether the style of the materials (vocabulary, form, illustrations, etc.) and date (if important, such as in the science field) are suitable for the collection.
- B. Limited means for the screening and selecting materials
 - 1. Suggestions from teachers, students, and other related to the field of education.
 - 2. Lists included in textbooks, supplemental materials, etc.
 - 3. Book displays, fairs, book stores, other library collections, etc.
 - 4. Screening of books recommended through Children's Catalog and Junior High School Library Catalog and the review sources used by them.
 - 5. Current needs in relation to the total present collection.
 - 6. Review of materials after they are received by the librarian and possibly others, such as other adults working in the library, language arts teachers, etc.
 - 7. Determine if subject matter, pictures, etc., are suitable for the individual library.
 - 8. Determine if the material has been reviewed by any noted sources.
 - 9. Consultation with other members of the profession.
 - 10. Gifts are examined critically in terms of the criteria which is applied to materials purchased for library use.
